Not far from this most international of Hague neighbourhoods are the restaurants managed by Entrada Restaurants www.entrada-restaurants.nl. In Scheveningen, and other locations, this group represents the global nature of this city. At the Fair they will offer a sampling of their kitchens which range from Mexico (Chicoleo) to Italy (La Galleria), with a detour via the Mediterranean Sea (Topkapi). For a mouth watering indication of their menus a visit to their website is not advised on an empty stomach; unless of course you are looking for a place to enjoy quality food and hospitality.

Further in town, and in an area referred to as 'Avenue Culinaire' located around the Bierkade in downtown The Hague, Serengeti www.restaurant-serengeti.com offers the tastes of Africa.
